Curriculum for Certificate Course in Japanese (Level 1)

Session: 2024-2025

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Mission:

- 1. To promote skills of different language in the university graduates for study and employment overseas
- 2. To improve the intercultural and interlinguistic communicative competence of the graduates.

Vision:

Rajshahi University graduates will have the chance to

- 1. develop their competence in the major foreign languages of the world which will be useful for them for study abroad, and for employment overseas.
- 2. They will be able to communicate in multilingual and multicultural situations.

Programme Objectives:

- 1. To facilitate teaching and learning of the major foreign languages of the world.
- 2. To promote multiculturalism and multilingualism in Rajshahi University graduates.

Programme Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Students will have working vocabulary of foreign languages.
- 2. They will be able to read, write, speak and listen effectively in the offered foreign languages.

Course Description:

The certificate course in Japanese is of Six months' duration and it consists of one paper of 100 marks. Final examination will be held at the end of the semester. Results will be published in grading system.

Course Learning Objectives:

To help learners develop knowledge and skills of Japanese for study and employment in Japanese context and also to work with Japanese in home context.

Course Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Students will be familiar with Japanese alphabet, and sound system of Japanese language.
- 2. They will have working knowledge of Japanese vocabulary, and
- 3. They will be able to read, write, speak and listen to Japanese effectively.

Course Contents:

- 1. Japanese alphabet, sound system and its Romanization: Vowels, Consonants plus vowel sounds, sounds with ーや, -ゆ and ーよ syllabic consonants, Rendaku, etc. 1C/10
- 2. Hiragana, Katakana and Kanji, use of hiragana for two successive vowels, use of hiragana for particles. 2C/20
- 3. Sentence patterns: 1C/10
- 4. Greetings: Greetings: [おはいよう]ございます Good morning, こんにちは Hello, こんばんは Good evening, おやすみなさい Good Night, さようなら Goodbye,どうもThanks, ありがとうございます Thank you, どういたしまして You're welcome, すみません Excuse me, ほんとにすみません I'm very sorry, はじめまして How do you do, きよつけて Take care, おぢまします Sorry to bother you, ごめんなちい I'm terribly sorry, どうしましたか What's the matter?], おだいじに Take good care of yourself, かんぱい Cheers! etc. ½C/5

- 5. A. Counting (a) number from 1 to 20, (b) number- multiples of 10, (c) number from 21 to 100, (d) number- multiples of 100 up to 1000, (e) number- multiples of 1000 up to 10,000. ½C/5
 - B. Counters: (Hours of the day, days of the week, months of the year, day-date, time etc.)
 - (i) Count of dates: tsuitachi, futsuka, etc.; (ii) Count of pieces: hitotsu, futatsu, etc.; (iii) Count of men: hitori, futari, etc.; (iv) Count of floors: Ikkai, Nikai, etc.; (v) Count of liquid: Ippai, Nihai, etc.; (vi) Count of times: Ichido, Nido, etc.; (vii) Count of Period: Ippun, Nifun, etc.; (viii) Count of hours: Ichijikan, Nijikan, etc.; (ix) Count of weeks: Isshukan, Nishukan, etc.; (x) Count of months: Ikkagetsu, Nikagetsui, etc.; (xi) Count of years: Ichinen, Ninen, etc. ½C/5
- 6. Introduction to Kanji and the use of Kanji characters in Japanese. Origin and writing pattern of kanjis using pictographix and kanji and kana mnemonics. 2C/20

Reading from the text: 2C/20

- 7. Hours of the day, days of the week, months of the year, day-date and time. 2C/20
- 8. Use of いる, ある, ぐらい, ごろ, も, よく, まい and あまり. ½C/5
- 9. Present and past forms of verbs for both affirmative and negative forms: ½C/5

-ます, -ました, -ません, -ませんでしたfrom of the following verbs: いる, ある, くる, ようむ, よぶ, かえる, みる, でかける, する, のむ, たべる, かく, やる, かう, あう, ねむ, おきる, あそぶ, べんきようする, きく, はなす, あるく, はしる, ふる, できる, わかる, かかる, あける, しめる, etc.

- 10. Use of the following: 2C/20

 かう-かいましょう, あう-あいましょう, かえる-かえりましょう, ようむ-ようみましょう, のむ-のみましょう, いく-いきましょう, くる-きましょう, あける-あけましょう, しめる-しめましょう, etc.
- 11. Use of Hiragana for Particles, Demonstratives [こう, そう, あー, どう], Interrogative Nouns, Connecting two Nouns, Prenominal Demonstratives, Adjectival Predicates, Adjectival Demonstratives, Adverbial Demonstratives, Adverbs of Degree, Noun Conjoining Particles, Conjunctions, Approximation, Nominalization of a Verb, etc. 1C/10
- 12. Translation from English to Japanese (only simple sentence).
- 13. Translation from Japanese to English (only simple sentence).
