Instructions to Authors

Rajshahi University Journal of Life & Earth and Agricultural Sciences is an official journal of the University of Rajshahi. It is published annually and publishes only research work of original nature in life & earth and agricultural sciences, by the teachers and researchers of the faculties/institutes concerned.

Manuscripts submitted for publication in Rajshahi University Journal of Life & Earth and Agricultural Sciences undergo full peer review by two external referees. The suitability of manuscripts is judged by the reviewers and editors, and the editors' decision on a paper is final. A letter of acceptance is given only after an article has been finally accepted by the Editorial Board. To prepare and submit a manuscript the following guidelines should be followed:

- 1. Articles submitted must not have been published or be under consideration elsewhere.
- 2. Three copies of the manuscript in English typed clearly with double spacing on one side of A4 size white offset paper with adequate margin (at least 2.5 cm on all sides) should be submitted (along with a soft copy in CD) to the Secretary, Rajshahi University Journal of Life & Earth and Agricultural Sciences & Deputy Chief Information Officer, Publications Office, Rajshahi University, Rajshahi. All pages should be numbered consecutively.
- 3. There should be a title page with only title, name(s) of the author(s) and affiliation address(es). The second page should carry the 'Title' of the paper followed by 'Abstract', 'Keywords', 'Introduction', 'Materials and methods', 'Results', 'Discussion' (or 'Results and discussion'), 'Acknowledgements' (if any), 'References' etc.
- 4. Names and affiliations of authors and corresponding author's e-mail ID should be presented as follows:

- 5. **References:** Every reference cited in the text should be included in the reference list and every entry in the reference list should have been mentioned in the text at least once.
- (i) In the text: References should be made by giving the author's name with the year of publication (example: Paul & Routray, 2013). When reference is made to a work by three or more authors the first name followed by *et al.* is used on all occasions (example: Reza *et al.*, 2012). If several papers by the same author(s) and from the same year are cited, then a,b,c, etc., should be put after the year of publication (example: Tarique & Paul. 2005a,b). When citing a list of papers, place them in chronological order, and alphabetically within years. Separate references with semi-colons (example: Jahan & Ahmed, 1997; Kabir, 2009; Das & Dixon, 2012; Sarker *et al.*, 2012).

- Reference in a periodical: Example: Ahsan, M.K. 2012. Selection strategies considering varietal differences with respect to egg characters of mulberry silkworm, Bombyx mori L. University Journal of Zoology, Rajshahi University, 31: 19-22.
- (ii) When there is more than one author: Example: Khan, Y.A., Lateh, H., Baten, M.A. & Kamil, A.A. 2012. Critical antecedent rainfall conditions for shallow landslides in Chittagong City of Bangladesh. *Environmental Earth Sciences*, 67 (1): 97-106.
- (iii) **For a book:** Example: Rahman, M.M., Ahmed, M.B. & Hossain, M.M. 2011. Biotechnological approach for the mass propagation of Gerbera: Rapid production of a commercially important flower, Gerbera. *LAP LAMBERT Academic Publishing*: 1-92.
- (iv) **An article from edited book/proceedings:** Example: Das, B.C. 2012. Ecosystem services and conservation value of Himalayan insects with special reference to Uttarakhand under the influence of the changing climate. **In:** Hartmann, M. & Weipert, J. (eds): *Biodiversität und Naturausstattung im Himalaya IV* Verein der Freunde und Forderer des Naturkundemuseums Erfurt e.V., Erfurt, 15 -17. April 2011: 121-127.
- (v) **Information hosted on a web site:** Example: FAO. 2010. Domestic Animal Diversity Information System. Retrieved from: http://www.fao.org/dad-is/ on 10 May 2010.
 - For a work that has been accepted for publication but not yet published, "In press" should be written in place of the year of publication. Expected year of publication can not be inserted.
- 6. Tables should be numbered consecutively as they are cited in the text (Table 1, 2 etc.). Each table should be on a separate page (at the end of the document) with the number and heading above and any notes below the table. Ensure that tables are as simple as possible and avoid vertical rules which are expensive and difficult to set.
- 7. Figures should be numbered consecutively as they are cited in the text (Figure 1, 2, etc). Use italic letters for parts a, b, c, etc. Legends must be provided for each figure. Figures should also be supplied as JPG format.
- 8. Authors will have to proof-read and proof-read manuscript should be returned as soon as possible with necessary corrections. No new material can be inserted during proof-reading.
- 9. Manuscripts will be acknowledged on receipt. Manuscripts not accepted for publication will be returned. No paper will be published unless it conforms to the style specified above. A corresponding author will receive 20 copies of off-prints and a copy of the journal free of cost.
