- b) The maximum age of a student shall be 30 years for the candidacy in the election of the Hall Students' Union.
- c) Students, who have been suspended from the academic programs for being accused and convicted of unlawful and subversive conducts against the University or the state, will not be eligible for membership.

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3. CESSATION OF MEMBERSHIP

A student whose name has been suspended, struck off or withdrawn from the register of the University shall cease to be a member of the Union. The Vice-President of the Hall Union may, with the prior approval of the President of Hall Union, allow a student to continue as a member for a period not exceeding 30 days in relaxation of this rule.

PART-II

4. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

All the members of the Executive Committee with the exception of the President and the Treasurer shall be elected annually by the Union at a date fixed by the President and duly notified.

The Executive Committee shall consist of -

(i)	President-Provost ((Ex-Officio))
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(ii) Treasurer (Ex-Officio)

(iii) Vice-President (VP)

(iv) General Secretary (GS)

(v) Assistant General Secretary (AGS)

Secretary, Debate & Literary Affairs

Assistant Secretary, Debate & Literary Affairs

(yiii) Secretary, Common Room

Assistant Secretary, Common Room

(x) Secretary, Sports and Games

(xi) Assistant Secretary, Sports and Games

(xii) Secretary, Cultural Affairs

(xiii) Assistant Secretary, Cultural Affairs

(xiv) Executive Member-1

(xv) Executive Member-2

(xvi) Executive Member-3

(xvii) Executive Member-4

5. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- (a) The Executive Committee shall be responsible for organizing and controlling all activities of the Union.
- (b) The General Secretary of the Union shall also be the Secretary to the Executive Committee.
- (c) One-third of the members of the Executive Committee shall form a quorum for a meeting of the Executive Committee provided that for the budget meeting the quorum shall be formed by at least 75% of the total number of members. No quorum shall be necessary for adjourned meetings.
- (d) At least 3 days' notice must be given for a meeting of the Executive Committee. This rule will not apply to emergency meetings.

6. CESSATION OF ELECTED MEMBER(S)

- (a) The elected members of the Executive Committee must attend at least half of the number of the meetings of the Union and of the Executive Committee each of them being counted separately at the end of each term. In default they will be considered to have retired and their place shall be filled up by the President in consultation with the Executive Committee.
- (b) The elected office-bearers shall cease to hold office on their ceasing to be regular students of the University. The Provost may, however, allow an office-bearer who is an examinee to remain in office until her/his examination is over.
- (c) Office-Bearers, whose names have been struck off the register of the University and are not restored within two months, will cease to be office-bearers.

7. CHARGE HAND-OVER AND TAKE OVER

As soon as the result of the election has been formally declared, the President of the Union shall notify the date on which the out-going Executive Committee shall hand over charge of the Office to the new Executive Committee. The newly elected Executive Committee shall, within ten days from the day on which they assume the charge of office, hold a formal Installation Ceremony.

PART-III

OFFICE-BEARERS OF THE UNION AND THEIR FUNCTIONS

8. President

- (i) The Provost of the Hall shall be the President of the Union.
- (ii) He shall guide and advise the office-bearers in realizing the objectives of the Union.
- (iii) He shall control the finances and accounts of the Union jointly with the Treasurer.
- (iv) He shall have a casting vote in case of a tie which he may exercise in her/his discretion.
- (v) He shall assign such duties to the members of the Executive Committee as may be deemed necessary.
- (vi) The President shall have the right of vote on any matter for discussion in Union if any matter adversely affects the interest of the Union.
- (vii) No subject shall be discussed which has not received, at least one day before discussion, the sanction of the President.
- (viii) The President shall have the power at any time, in the interest of the Union, to dismiss any office-bearer or member of the Executive Committee or dissolve the Executive Committee as a whole and may call for a fresh election within one month excluding



- holidays and vacation or take such other action as he thinks fit for proper functioning of the Union.
- Subject to the approval of the Vice-Chancellor, the President shall have the authority to (ix) suspend the Union.
- He shall have the power to certify the budget of the Union, if necessary. (x)
- He shall have the power to disallow any activity which, in his opinion directly or (xi) indirectly affects the administration of the Hall or the University or be repugnant to the aims and objects of the Union.
- The interpretation of the rules and regulations of the Constitution of the Union shall rest (xii) with the President whose decision shall be final. Any matter not covered by the Constitution of the Hall Union shall be decided by its President and his decision thereon shall be final.
- (xiii) The President shall nominate the Treasurer from among the House Tutors of the Hall.
- (xiv) Pending the Constitution of the Executive Committee and the election of office bearers or adoption of the budget, the President shall have the power to arrange for carrying on the activities of the Union and incur necessary expenditure.

The Syndicate at its own initiative, when considered necessary, or on the recommendation of the Provost may add to, alter or amend these rules or any provision there under or a part thereof which will come into effect from the date of the passing of the resolution by the Syndicate or any other date fixed by it.

9. Treasurer

- The Treasurer shall control, in consultation with the President, all funds and accounts of the Union and shall advice regarding its financial policy.
- He shall advance money to the General Secretary in terms of budget provisions.
- (iii) He shall check the accounts maintained by the General Secretary from time to time. The General Secretary shall submit all original vouchers to the Treasurer.
- (iv) He shall pass all bills and shall see that no expenditure is incurred which is not in accordance with the provisions of the budget.
- (v) He shall arrange for an annual audit of the accounts of the Union by an Audit Board.
- (vi) Any member of the Union may ask in writing any elected office-bearer any question connected with the duties of his office provided (three days) notice is given for this and the answer shall be read out by the officer concerned at the next meeting of the Union and shall be open to discussion. Such question shall pass through the President whose decision regarding the question shall be final.

If any elected office-bearer of the Union is absent from the Union for ten weeks in a session, excluding the University long vacation, the autumn vacation and the winter holidays, he shall be deemed to have resigned his office, and a fresh office-bearer shall be elected in his place in a meeting of the Executive Committee. No one shall be considered to have held the office to which he was elected member; he has carried out the duties of that office for at least six months. If the office bearer is absent for a period longer than two months, the Executive Committee may elect any member of the Union to officiate in place of such office-bearer.

10. Vice-President

- (i) The Vice-President shall be the Chief Executive of the Union subject to the control of the President. He shall co-ordinate the activities of the different sections of the Union. The Sectional Secretaries (except the Secretary of Sports and Games) shall submit their estimate of expenditure to the Treasurer through the Vice-President. He shall prepare the annual program of activities and the budget of the Union under the supervision and guidance of the Treasurer and with the assistance of the General Secretary. The program and the budget so prepared shall be presented for approval to a meeting of the Executive Committee presided by the President. At the end of his term of office the President shall prepare with the assistance of the General Secretary, a report of the activities of the Union and a statement of its accounts both of which shall be placed before the Executive Committee for approval,
- (ii) The Vice-President shall have the power to report to the President any cases of willful damage or loss of the Union property or any infringement of rules on the part of members.
- (iii) He shall have such other authority and power as may be delegated to her/him by the President from time to time.
- (iv) He shall preside over all meetings of the Union in the absence of the President or as when desired by the President.
- (v) Out of the contingency fund the Vice-President can spend any sum on her/his own authority up to Tk.1000/- per month. The sanction of the Treasurer will be necessary for any expenditure above Tk.1000/- in a month.

11. General Secretary

- (i) The General Secretary shall call meetings of the Executive Committee and the Union and prepare the agenda with the prior approval of the President.
- (ii) He shall record and maintain proceedings of all meetings of the Executive Committee and the Union and shall submit them for confirmation at the next meeting of the Executive Committee or the Union as the case may be.
- (iii) He shall conduct correspondence of the Union.

- (iv) He shall be in charge of the properties of the Union. He shall maintain accounts of the Union under the guidance of the Treasurer. With the consent of the Vice-President he may obtain money from the Treasurer to meet the monthly expenses of the Union and shall keep vouchers thereof.
- (v) He shall organize such functions as may be authorized by the President or the Executive Committee.

12. Assistant General Secretary

The Assistant General Secretary shall ordinarily assist the General Secretary in the management of the affairs of the Union and shall discharge all duties of the General Secretary in his absence. He shall also do any other work assigned to him by the President or the Executive Committee.

13. Secretary, Debate & Literary Affairs

The Debate & Literary Affairs Secretary shall arrange the publication of the Hall Magazine and shall organize literary meetings such as debates, lectures, talks etc. and hold literary competitions. He shall also act as Secretary to the Editorial Board of the Magazine.

2464/214. Assistant Secretary, Debate & Literary

He shall ordinarily assist the Secretary and discharge all her/his duties in his absence

15. Secretary, Common Room

The Secretary Common Room shall be responsible for books and newspapers belonging to the Union. He shall maintain a list of newspapers and periodicals received by the Union from day to day and shall arrange for the issue and return of books and back numbers of periodicals. He shall remain in charge of the Common Room.

16. Assistant Secretary, Common Room

He shall ordinarily assist the Secretary, Common Room and discharge all her/his duties in his absence.

17. Secretary, Sports and Games

The Secretary shall arrange the indoor games of the Hall. He shall remain in charge of the indoor games room and hold indoor games competition. He shall work as the Secretary of Sports Committee in indoor games and Inter-Hall Sports and Games.

18. Assistant Secretary, Sports and Games

He shall ordinarily assist the Secretary, Sports and games and discharge all his duties in his absence.

19. Secretary, Cultural Affairs

He shall organize drama performances and variety of other entertainments, musical soirees and other cultural activities subject to the approval of the President or the Executive Committee.

20. Assistant Secretary, Cultural Affairs

He shall ordinarily assist the Secretary and discharge all his duties in his absence.

21*Executive Members

The elected Executive Members under Section 6 (Executive Committee) shall be the parts of Executive Committee and shall remain present in the Executive Committee meetings and work according to the desire of Executive Committee. They may be given the membership of various secretarial sub-committees, charges of actions and functions which are not earmarked with any secretarial posts, or any other activities given by the Executive Committee from time to time.

22. Committee for Sports and Games

(i) There shall be Sports Committee which shall be responsible for management of the affairs of the Sports and Games Section of the Union.

(ii) The Committee shall be constituted as follows:

- (a) President-President of the Union (Ex-Officio)
- (b) Treasurer-Treasurer of the Union (Ex-Officio)
- (c) Secretary-Sports and Games Secretary of the Union (Ex-Officio)
- (d) Members; (i) Assistant Secretary, Sports and games (Ex-Officio)
 - (ii) Not more than 4 Captains of Sectional games elected by players of each sectional game.

(iii) Election of Captain:

The Captain of each team shall maintain a list of players who participated in Hall matches (competition, friendly and practice-game). At the end of each season He shall submit to the President a complete list of players and specify therein the names of players who played in at least fifty percent of the practice games. The Captain for the next season shall be elected by all players who played in the competition and friendly matches or played in at least fifty percent of the practice games. If the captain of a particular game fails to submit this list within the date prescribed by the President then the latter shall, after due inquiries, publish a list containing the names of players who will be eligible to vote in the election of the Captain of that particular game.

All players who use goods and gears belonging to the sports section of the Union shall return those to the sports & games Secretary after use.

23. Vote of No-Confidence

A vote of No-Confidence for neglect of duties or infringement of rules may be passed against any office-bearer, (except the President and the Treasurer) or against the Executive Committee as a whole. The motion for no confidence shall not be proposed except at the written request signed by at least half the members of the Union. Such a motion shall be considered in a general meeting of the Union attended by at least half the members of the Union and the motion shall be taken as carried only when it is passed by two-third majority of the members present in the meeting. In the event of such a motion being passed, the individual or individuals or the whole Committee, as the case may be, concerned shall resign his or their office or offices of the Executive Committee immediately and the usual procedure of filling up the vacancy or vacancies shall be followed. A notice of at least 10 days must be given for proposing a No-Confidence motion.

PART-IV

24. Audit Board

There shall be an Audit Board consisting of the Treasurer and two members nominated by the President from the Union for the purpose of auditing the accounts of the Union. The Treasurer shall be the Chairman of the Board. The Board shall submit its report and recommendations to the President who will place these before the Executive Committee for scrutiny and opinion and then take such action as he thinks necessary.

PART- V

25. Election Rules

- (i) Every bona fide member (Clause 2b) of the Hall Union shall have the right to vote in electing members of the Executive Committee and to contest for membership of the said Committee (except for the offices of the President and the Treasurer).
- (ii) The name of each candidate desiring to be elected must be proposed by one student-member and seconded by another in writing.
- (ii) Every candidate shall, at the time of nomination, either personally or by an agent (authorized in writing) give her/his consent in writing.
- (iv) Each candidate shall be nominated by a separate nomination paper.
- (v) Every nomination paper shall be submitted to the Returning Officer within the date and time notified by him.

- (vi) A candidate who has been duly nominated for election may withdraw his candidature by a written and signed communication delivered to the Returning Officer not less than two clear days before the date fixed for election.
- (vii) The Returning Officer may be the President himself or any person appointed by him. The President will fix and notify the date and time of holding elections.
- (viii) The President or Returning Officer shall notify the date, time and place for scrutiny of nomination papers.
- (ix) The President or Returning Officer shall examine the nomination papers and shall give decision on all objections and may reject any nomination paper on the ground that it is not valid under the rules. Such decisions shall be endorsed by him on the nomination paper and the reason for rejection shall be noted in writing.
- (x) During the scrutiny of the ballot papers the candidates for election may be present either in person or through an authorized agent.
- (xi) Any objection with regard to the election may be filled with the President within three days of the publications of the results and the President's decision shall be final. No action will lie against this decision in any court of law.

PART-VI

- 26. There shall be two kinds of meetings of the Union: Public meetings which shall include debates, lectures, talks, reading of paper, etc. and, private business meetings which shall be open to members of the Union only.
- 27. The President shall usually preside over all the meetings of the Union. In his absence, the Vice-President or any other member of the Union nominated by the President shall preside. The General Secretary shall not preside. Anybody presiding over the meeting of the Union or of the Executive Committee shall be called the Chairman of the meeting.
- **28.** The Chairman shall interpret the laws of the Union and shall give rulings in case no law exists. The rulings of the Chairman shall be final unless over-ruled by the President.
- **29**. 30 members of the Union shall form a quorum in a Private business meeting of the Union and two days notice shall be given. No such notice shall be required for adjourned meetings. 30 members of the Union shall form the quorum in a Debate meeting.
- **30.** A requisition for holding a Private business meeting may be sent to the President provided it is signed by at least 30 or one-tenth of the members of the Union whichever is less and he shall direct the office-bearer (unless he rules it out) concerned to notify such meeting at least two days prior to the date of the meeting.

PART-VII

Rules of Discussion in a meeting

- 31 Every motion must be seconded, otherwise it will drop.
- **32**. A motion standing in the name of a member who is absent from the meeting may be proposed by any other member with the permission of the Chairman.
- **33.** The Chairman has the same right as any other member, of proposing or seconding a motion or amendment, and of addressing the meeting.
- 34. Any member may at any time in the course of a discussion rise and call the attention of the Chairman to a point of order. If a point of order be raised by a member in the course a speech by another the speaker shall stop until the Chairman has decided it. The Chairman shall be the sole judge of any point of order and may at her/his own instance or at the instance of any member call the member who is speaking to order. If the member so called to order disregards such order, the Chairman may direct her/him to sit down. If the member so directed disobeys such order, the Chairman may declare the member offending and suspend her/him as a member of the meeting. Such member shall immediately withdraw from the premises of the meeting. But any member may demand in writing any ruling of the Chairman in case s/he is not the President which, if the member so desires, he may submit to the President for consideration and revision.
- 35. On putting a motion or amendment to vote the Chairman shall call for the expression of the opinion of the meeting by a show of hands and shall declare the result thereof.
- 36. The Chairman shall have the right to vote and in case of a tie, shall have a casting vote.
- 37. When a discussion is prolonged the Chairman may limit the length of speeches, having tegard to the feeling of the House. He may also close the discussion and call on the mover to reply, or adjourn it to a further meeting.

PART-VIII

38. Hall Magazine

There shall be an Editorial Board which shall be responsible for the publication of the Annual Magazine of the Hall. The Editorial Board shall be constituted as follows:

- (i) President of the Union President (Ex-officio)
- (ii) Two teachers of the University (to be appointed by the President)
- (iii) Editor (elected by the member of the Executive Committee).
- (iv) Assistant Editor/Editors (elected by the members of the Executive Committee).
- (vi) Secretary, Debate & Literary Affairs (Ex-officio).

PART-IX

Annual Budget

- **39**. The Executive Committee shall prepare a budget of expenditure and cause it to be placed before the Union within fourteen days of their coming into office.
- **40.** The draft budget shall be published on the notice board at least two days before the budget meeting. Members of the Union shall have the right of suggesting changes and modifications in the budget in the meeting of the Union called for the consideration of the budget. The budget as amended, modified and passed by the majority of the members present in the meeting will be considered as the approved budget of the Union.

PART-X

Amendment of the Constitution

- 41. A notice for amendment of the Constitution or any part thereof, shall be placed by the President of the Union before the general meeting of the Union provided the notice is signed by half the members of the Union. An amendment proposed shall be considered as an accepted if two third of the members present in the general meeting cast their votes in favor of such amendment or amendments.
- **42**. 75% of the members of the Union shall have to be present in any such meeting to form a quorum.

Appendix:

SPORTS CLUB AND STUDENTS' UNION ORDINANCE

- 1. Subject to the control of the Provosts in the case of the Hall Unions and Hall Clubs, and of the Presidents in the case of the University Students' Union and the University Sports Club, the affairs of these bodies shall be managed by the relevant authorities according to the regulations laid down in their existing constitutions.
- 2. No change in the existing Constitutions of any of the above bodies shall be effective except the consent of the Provost or of the President, as the case may be.
- 3. In any emergency, the Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to suspend any student organization within the University (including those within the Halls) and may take such other action as s/he thinks fit and shall report her/his action to the next meeting of the Syndicate.

Note: Any other point respect to the University Sports Club, the University Students' Union, and the Hall Unions shall be dealt with by instructions issued by the Vice-Chancellor.
